January: The Holy Name of Jesus & Respect Life Month



....including His Name. The Archangel Gabriel first spoke the name of Jesus to His mother, *"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus"* (Luke 1:31). The Archangel was only a messenger, so it was the Father in Heaven who gave Jesus his name.

St Peter was one of the first Apostles to speak with authority in the Holy Name of Jesus when he healed a crippled man saying, "I have neither silver nor gold, but what I do have I give you: in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean, rise and walk" (Acts 3:6). St Paul also exalted the holy name of Jesus when he said, "...at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:9–10).

Throughout the history of the Church, Jesus' name has been invoked as an instrument of personal faith in the Son of God, especially to command demons or simply to pray to Jesus in a repetitive and personal way. The liturgical Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus has been celebrated by the Church for many centuries, especially within various religious orders, including the Franciscans and the Jesuits. Today, the first Greek letters of Jesus' name – IHS – are common on our churches' tabernacles, altars, and stained glass windows.

Repeating Jesus' name prayerfully or speaking it aloud brings Him close and gives you strength, provided you recite His name in faith. The name of Jesus casts out fear, arouses trust, and unites your heart to His. Sadly, the Most Holy Name of Jesus is so holy that the evil one often tempts people to invoke it as a curse when angry, without even considering what they are doing.

Ponder the prayer below that is attributed to St Bernardine of Sienna. Know and believe that the divine name of our Lord brings Him close to you and bestows His grace in abundance.

Jesus, Name full of glory, grace, love, and strength! You are the refuge of those who repent, our banner of warfare in this life, the medicine of souls, the comfort of those who mourn, the delight of those who believe, the light of those who preach the true faith, the wages of those who toil, the healing of the sick. To You our devotion aspires; by You our prayers are received; we delight in contemplating You. O Name of Jesus, You are the glory of all the saints for eternity. Amen.

CANDLEMAS: The Feast of Light and Hope

On February 2, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, forty days after Christmas. In the 1962 calendar the feast is called the "Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary" and commonly referred to as Candlemas. This is the last feast of the liturgical calendar that we commemorate Christ still as an infant child.

Although this is considered a Christmas feast, it also is clearly connected to the upcoming Lenten and Easter seasons. Mary and Joseph offering Jesus to God is the beginning of His earthly ministry for His Heavenly Father. This is the first of Our Lady's seven sorrows, and a foreshadowing of the Cross.

Even the popular name **Candlemas** hints at the "light to reveal you to the nations" that we celebrate at Easter, the ultimate feast of Light. The blessing of candles is more than a strong indicator of the upcoming Paschal Candle.

Fr. Charles will be blessing church candles (as well as those brought from home by parishioners) at the beginning of the 12:10pm Mass on Friday, February 2, at Sacred Heart. If you'd like your personal candles to be blessed, please put them in place by noon that day.

PART FOUR: ON SIN and ITS KINDS from THE BALTIMORE CATECHISM

WHY ARE THE SEVEN SOURCES OF SIN CALLED CAPITAL SINS? The seven sources of sin are called capital sins because they rule over our other sins and are the causes of them.

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY OUR PREDOMINANT SIN OR RULING PASSION? By our predominant sin, or ruling passion, we mean the sin into which we fall most frequently and which we find it hardest to resist.

HOW CAN WE BEST OVERCOME OUR SINS? We can best overcome our sins by guarding against our predominant or ruling sin.

SHOULD WE GIVE UP TRYING TO BE GOOD WHEN WE SEEM NOT TO SUCCEED IN OVERCOMING OUR FAULTS? We should not give up trying to be good when we seem not to succeed in overcoming our faults, because our efforts to be good will keep us from becoming worse than we are.

WHAT VIRTUES ARE OPPOSED TO THE SEVEN CAPITAL SINS? Humility is opposed to pride; generosity to covetousness; chastity to lust; meekness to anger; temperance to gluttony; brotherly love to envy; and diligence to sloth.
