

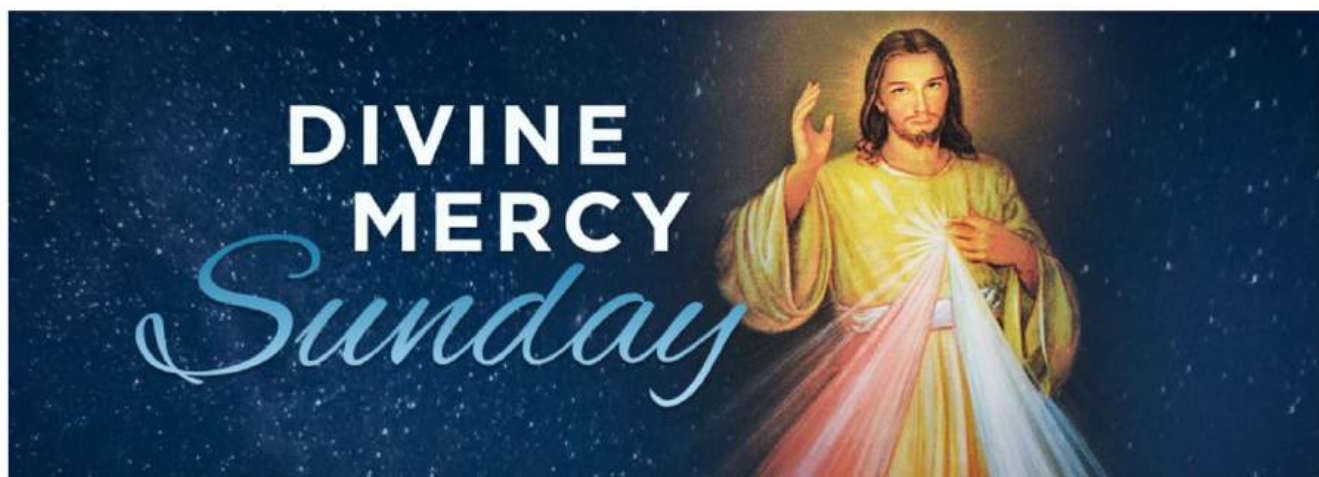

VOCATIONS MINISTRY

We do not usually recognize how much valor it takes to be a priest. **April 13 is the memorial of Pope Saint Martin I.** He upheld the ancient understanding that Jesus has both a human *and* a divine nature — *True God and True Man* — and resisted the heresy of Monothelism that claimed Jesus has only a divine nature and as such could not suffer physically or emotionally nor could He relate to us with full human experience. The Byzantine Emperor Constans II was a Monothelitist (in part because it meant that humans, including emperors, could be excused easily for their flesh-driven peccadilloes). He had St. Martin kidnapped, imprisoned, and banished to the Crimea where he died from torture and starvation in the year 655. St. Martin is patron saint of all clergy who defend theological and moral truth, and who do not compromise in the hope that they or the Church may become more popular. That is **VALOR!**

St. Thérèse of Lisieux's idea of valor was to do little things with great love and to do so at least ten times per day. Proverbs 24:16 says: *"The just man falls seven times, but rises up again."* St. Thérèse said she might fall hundreds of times, but she committed herself to not give up and would try to rise again and again and again.

A parish priest must do the same. He may not get kidnapped by a hostile heretical emperor, but the government often puts restrictions on Church actions. There are always people in the parish who complain about his decisions or schedule. The media express insults and criticisms with unsleeping malevolence. Moral and diplomatic clarity is not always easy to know. Yet the pastor must make decisions and take proper action. That, too, is **VALOR!**
